# Melina Simonds, Cuesta College

- Offering a robust number of classes for the summer; four (3 unit) classes and one (1 unit) class
- Courses have been shared within the community but also statewide; summer enrollment is looking really good especially for those TK teachers who need those 24 units by August

### Shana Paulson, Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo County

• Close of Contract Monitoring Review is tomorrow; had a preliminary close and everything went really well.

### Mika Buchanan, Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo County

- Finally received the funding for the Subsidized Child Care Stipends that come from AB 179;
  - \$1442 per subsidized child served during the month of April 2022
  - Funding will go out to all providers in our county that served children during the month of April and also completed the ARPA Survey. If the ARPA Survey has not been completed they will not be eligible to receive payment.
  - 57% of providers have completed the survey.
  - Stipends will be issued over the course of this month to the providers that have completed the survey.
- Family fees have been waived through this fiscal year June 30, 2023; though it looks like they will extend that through September. While the fees are being extended they are looking at revising the actual fees to make them a little more equitable.

# Lauren Handley, San Luis Obispo County Office of Education

  - The purpose of this grant program is to expand access universally to preschool programs for three- and four-year-old children across the state through a mixed-delivery system. The program funds local planning councils (LPCs) and resource and referral (R&R) agencies to support the mixed delivery system of Universal PreKindergarten (UPK). The grant focus is to support the relationship building between the local education agencies (LEAs), county office of education (COE), the LPC, and the R&R. The grantee will partner with the LEA and COE to align plans for the expansion of UPK.
  - Projected Allocation San Luis Obispo County: \$197,986.00 (through June 2026)

    - Coordinate with the County Office of Education
    - Form a Plan single local workgroup for, but not directly funded, UPK options in a mixed delivery system.
